



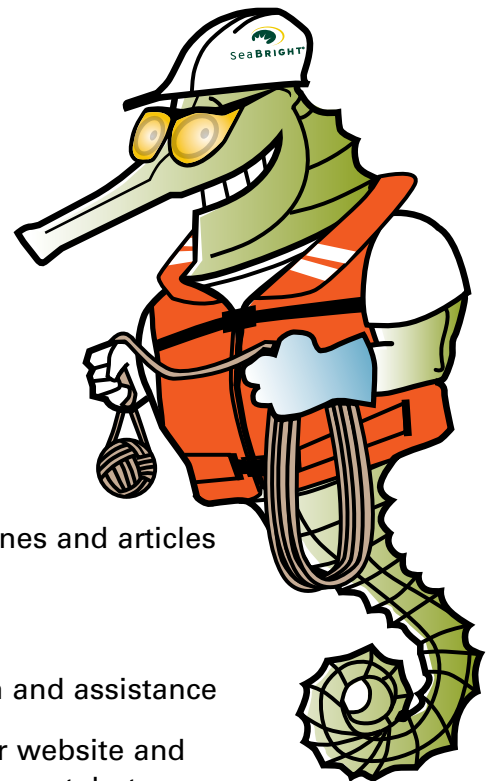
Introducing Sonny the Safety Seahorse!
